Campus Ministry is committed to cultivating the faith of all Notre Dame students. Through undergraduate, graduate, liturgical and music ministries, we foster personal spiritual growth, encourage participation in the sacramental and liturgical life of the Church, support other forms of worship and personal prayer, provide opportunities for pilgrimages, retreats and service, and seek to enhance and develop lifelong faith formation.

Faith Sharing Groups

Campus Ministry offers a variety of undergraduate faith sharing groups to help students strengthen their faith, meet new friends and worship with others.

Music

Music ministry helps to develop a deep and varied prayer life among all Notre Dame students, faculty and staff, as well as the extended community at large. Our choirs and ensembles include students of all ages, majors and musical experience who sing at a variety of Masses and events on campus. Anyone is welcome to audition for these ensembles at any point in their journey at Notre Dame and, in some cases, no auditions are necessary.

Sacramental Preparation

Campus Ministry encourages students from all backgrounds and faith traditions to learn more about the Catholic Christian faith at Notre Dame, the heart of which is a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. Ministries that assist a person undertaking the journey are the RCIA and the Short Course.

Prayer from Around the World

The Prayer from Around the World series was created to provide a forum in which members of the Notre Dame community can learn about different religious traditions. Each year, Campus Ministry co-sponsors this series to provide deeper insights into Muslim prayer, Byzantine Catholic Akathist, Hindu prayer, Jewish prayer and Zen meditation.

Anchor Leadership Program

The Anchor Leadership Program (Anchor) seeks to cultivate the faith of our students, challenging them to go outside of themselves and share the Gospel. Anchor consists of communal formation, a retreat, leadership roles, and individual mentorship.
